Bridgend	Bridge Mentoring Plus Scheme	Bridge Mentoring Plus Scheme in Bridgend will use the grant to restart their mentoring programme for young people and children in the local community who are experiencing emotional distress or adverse experiences. £9,612 will fund a youth support co-ordinator, youth support worker, project activity costs, educational visits, volunteer expenses, resources, and room hire contribution.
Cardiff	Llandaff 50+	The project will extend and renovate a derelict building in the centre of Llandaff, Cardiff. It will provide a meeting space for older people offering a spectrum of activities, including IT, crafts' a dementia friendly hub as well as volunteering opportunities to the wider community. The project will build on the history of the building by providing a heritage room for participants to share stories about Llandaff and socialise. £5,159 over one year, will fund professional fees to develop costings and plans.
Cardiff	Go Kids Go!	Go Kids Go (Association of Wheelchair Children) will provide wheelchair skills training for physically disabled children in Cardiff. £2,200 will fund staff costs, transport and accommodation, equipment, venue hire, publicity, and administration costs.
Cardiff	BAWSO Ltd	BAWSO Ltd in Cardiff will use the grant to provide a series of healthy living workshops for BAME women who have experienced trauma. £9,474 will fund staff, travel, stationery, refreshments, volunteer expenses, project associates

Foundation	The project will build on the applicant's current work by delivering a global citizenship programme that will build the skills and increase engagement of young people in their communities. The project will benefit 600 young people aged 16 to 25 and will use new technologies to develop and provide opportunities for progression into further training and work experience. £290,644, over four years, will fund salaries (Training Officer & Volunteer Co-ordinator), recruitment, training, monitoring and evaluation, equipment, travel and overheads.
Carmarthenshire	In2Action - Cymru	In2Action - Cymru in Carmarthenshire will use the grant to provide volunteers with the opportunity to build their confidence and self-esteem by helping them to develop and support a group that will address the lack of local clubs that meets the need of children in the area. £9,922 will fund sessional worker costs, room hire, volunteer expenses, refreshments, stationery, and marketing costs.
Carmarthenshire	South Cefncaeau (Ty Enfys) Family Centre	South Cefncaeau (Ty Enfys) Family Centre in Carmarthenshire will use the grant to run a variety of activities, in order to strengthen the intergenerational relationships within their community. £10,000 will fund coordinator costs, utilities, professional fees, health and safety, and postage costs.

Carmarthenshire	Crossroads Sir Gar Limited	Crossroads Sir Gar Limited in Carmarthenshire will use the grant to give young carers an opportunity to combat issues such as poor mental health, loneliness and a lack of confidence by taking them on a series of respite trips. £10,000 will fund transport, tickets, and entrance fees.
Carmarthenshire	Junction 49	Junction 49 in Carmarthenshire will use the grant to provide training and voluntary opportunities in order to upskill the whole community. £9,050 will fund a website, insurance, volunteer expenses, room hire, laptops, stationery, training, and equipment.
Ceredigion	Canolfan Deuluol Llambedr Pont Steffan	The project will build on and enhance the centre's core services of drop-in baby and toddler groups by targeting particular issues identified by families. Parents will be supported to better understand key messages about child development and to use this knowledge to support their children. Sessions will be provided to increase speech and language skills through play, weaning and dummy awareness. The lunch club will be developed to help parents gain an understanding of how what they eat can impact on their health, cooking on a budget, meal planning, storing food and ensuring food is safe to eat. The third enhancement of the Centre's core services is providing additional support for young parents to increase social interaction and confidence through team building days in partnership with the outdoor activity centre at Denmark Farm. The grant,£90,510 over three years, will fund salaries, training and expenses, accommodation and utilities, marketing, monitoring and evaluation, professional fees, workshops and resources.

Newport	New Pathways Family Friendly Therapeutic Centre of Excellence	The project will build on the applicants' successful Lottery funded project SURE for Mental Health. It will continue to deliver its core work of teaching basic mental health to people to identify and support both themselves and others with mental health issues, and its suicide intervention and support training. The new elements will include a youth version of SURE tailored to suit their needs, the development of a mental health toolkit and mental health support groups run by and for people with experience of mental health issues. The £499,852 grant, over three years, will fund a full time Trainer/Project Co-ordinator, full time Project Officer, full time Community Co-ordinator/Group Facilitator and a part time Trainer/Workshop facilitator, recruitment, training, marketing, monitoring & evaluation, training manuals, expenses and client engagement events.
Pembrokeshire	Pembrokeshire Online CIC	Pembrokeshire Online CIC will use the grant to develop their free online magazine to provide opportunities for people to gain experience and enhance their employment prospects, resulting in greater community engagement and active citizenship. £9,500 will fund volunteer travel expenses, editing and website development, software and resources, a notebook laptop, additional internet and phone costs, event venue costs, and research time and collation of data.
Pembrokeshire	Bethesda Men's Shed	Bethesda Men's Shed in Pembrokeshire will use the grant to support men in their area to develop skills and improve their mental health, helping to develop their community. £9,650 will fund shed including delivery, site preparations, tools and equipment.

Pembrokeshire	Pembrokeshire Foster Carers Association (PFCA)	Pembrokeshire Foster Carers Association (PFCA) will use the grant to offer support to children in care, by providing them with opportunities to build confidence and socialise. £6,615 will fund horse riding, health classes, drama workshops, transport, and an artist.
Pembrokeshire	Solva Care	Solva Care will enhance and expand existing services by providing increased opportunities for social and community interaction such as afternoon teas and group sessions and stimulating group activity to include walks and talks, music and movement and intergeneration activities. Additionally, there will be meaningful volunteering opportunities created with the availability of accredited training. Powys	Bracken Trust Limited	Bracken Trust Limited, who deliver services to those suffering or recovering from cancer, will expand on the services at their base in Llandrindod Wells and develop wellbeing and community support services in hubs in Knighton and Llanidloes. This will include a robust, designated 'home support service' and a telephone support system 5 days of the week. A recruitment and retention strategy for volunteers will be developed and additional volunteers recruited to help at the hubs, and information technology will be improved making it more user friendly, interactive and bilingual. The grant, £499,964 over five years, will fund the salaries of three full time equivalent staff posts, training, travel expenses accommodation and utilities, marketing and communications, monitoring and evaluation and redundancy costs.
Rhondda Cynon Taf	Valleys Kids	The project will be working with families in poverty and or struggling to cope following austerity measures in Rhondda Cynon Taff. Beneficiaries will be families and individuals who are poor, socially isolated, lonely, lacking in confidence, with low self-esteem, many experiencing crisis in their lives due to low income. The grant of £498,833 will be spent working with a wide range of local organisations and service providers to deliver the project and refer and signpost and will benefit 300 individuals.
Swansea	Gendros Baptist Church	Gendros Baptist Church in Swansea will use the grant to run a mobile youth centre, designed to reach young people in their neighbourhoods and provide mentoring support for those experiencing isolation, loneliness, and criminal behaviours. £9,880 will fund staff training, volunteer, training, development worker fees, resources and training materials, refreshments, staff costs for a Youth Outreach Manager, leaflets, and posters.

Swansea	Townhill Community Centre	Townhill Community Centre in Swansea will use the grant to improve the facility for user groups and the wider community, to allow them to continue tackling poverty and loneliness in the local community. £3,875 will fund kitchen equipment, an electric cooker, painting costs, radiator covers, carpets, sports hall mats, lino, refreshments, and marketing costs.
Swansea	Crisis UK	Crisis UK will engage with homeless people who have lived experiences and provide training for them to act as volunteers in order to offer peer-to-peer support for other beneficiaries that are homeless. A psychology staff professional will also be employed in order to address complex mental health issues that some beneficiaries may be encountering. The purpose of the project is to work with beneficiaries, across Neath, Swansea and Port Talbot, in order to provide one-to-one support to obtain housing and address any mental health issues that are prominent. They will work closely with Skylight South Wales to deliver this project. £470,981, over four years, will cover salaries, expenses, marketing, evaluation, accommodation and other general running costs.
The Vale of Glamorgan	The Intersensory Club	The project will significantly increase the number of people with severe disabilities in wheelchairs participating in cycling and boating activities in the Barry area. New equipment, including a new power boat, and additional sessional hours will offer increased opportunities for engagement. The £85,000 grant, over five years, will fund a new boat, 1 x PT Sessional Manager, expenses, monitoring/evaluation and insurance.
