Group for Recycling in Argyle and Bute Trust Limited	Argyll and Bute	£49,999	The funding will be used to bring young people and the older generation together to reduce waste in the local area. They will share skills with each other that benefit the environment ' older people will show young people how to bake, upcycle clothes and furniture whereas young people will bring their knowledge of veganism to the table, as well as the idea of getting friends together to share and swap unwanted clothes. Volunteers will run pop-events covering these themes to get the wider community involved. This will not only reduce pollution and waste going to landfill, but build friendships between generations that will last long after the Platinum Jubilee
Nith Valley Leaf Trust	Dumfries and Galloway	£30,000	This project will support the development of a community garden for use in the rural village of Closeburn. To date, the garden has been managed at a very basic level through volunteers however this project would enable them to develop the current space to help it reach its full potential, including running workshops, clubs and activities to bring community members of all ages together and with the aim of the garden becoming self-sustainable bringing about a positive impact to the village and surrounding area.
The Scottish Seabird Centre	East Lothian	£49,773	This project will develop a programme for new marine ambassadors to secure the future of Scotland's marine environment. It will build a specialist hub for developing and supporting the community citizen scientists for the future around the Firth of Forth. This will engage 16'24-year-olds in marine ecology and conservation through the development of a science hub, helping to build their confidence and interest in green jobs.
Fuse Youth Cafe Glasgow	Glasgow City	£43,420	The funding will establish and develop a multimedia platform run by young people, for young people, allowing their diverse voices to be heard by influencers and decision makers. The idea has emerged from the young people the organisation currently works with and they will develop content that matters to them, including video interviews with the local Housing Association about how young people can get their first home; video documentaries about the history of the area and specific Jubilee-themed content.
The Language Hub C.I.C.	Glasgow City	£39,278	The project will deliver a range of activities across the age board which aim to make lasting impact upon participants and the community beyond the funding period including improved mental well-being, additional education, increased social networking, enhanced mixing of generations, less isolation and loneliness, improved community spirit. Activities will be open to all and will include art workshops, exhibitions, live music sessions, film nights, author and book reading events, creative writing workshops and board game sessions.

Network			the support provided to its network of 11 food pantries in and around the Glasgow and Western Scotland
			areas. This will raise the profile of the Food Pantry network and prevent surplus fresh produce being
			wasted and put in landfill through a series of Jubilee themed events and will continue to provide
			volunteers with a range of skills and training opportunities, to help them gain employment.
The Glencorse	Midlothian	£49,393	This project will allow the group to take a current derelict garden and transform it into a true community
Association			garden. This funding will allow the organisation to change the layout of the garden to include a natural
			play space for young children, a child-safe wildlife pond, a sustainable irrigation system, chill-out zones for
			young people and people with additional sensory and educational needs. The crowning jewel of the
			community garden will be the Queen's Jubilee Legacy Tea Garden.
Volunteering Hebrides	Na h-Eileanan Siar	£50,000	This project will create a new community garden situated in the only parkland of its kind on the Island of
			Stornoway. The group will offer a range of learning skills in growing produce including plants, flowers,
			herbs, fruit and vegetables to enhance skills focus on caring for the local environment. Volunteering
			opportunities will bring a range of social benefits - networking, reduced isolation, improved mental
			wellbeing and skills development.
Berwickshire Marine	Scottish Borders	£49,603	The project will use the funding to launch a community lobster hatchery in Eyemouth to raise awareness
Reserve (SCIO)			of marine life, the generations of local creel fishermen and vulnerability of fisheries and sustainability. For
			the Queen's Platinum Jubilee, a community day will be organised with a breeding hen lobster, 'Queen
			Lizzie', named in honour of the Queen. This aims to improve lobster stock levels while bringing the local
			community together.
Eat, Sleep, Ride CIC	Scottish Borders	£50,000	This project will develop and expand the riding school's current facility to a multi-use sports facility and
			multipurpose centre available community use and/or service provision by a range of user groups including
			holistic therapists. The group also plan to re-wild the current landscape utilising a quarry area as a space
			to hold outdoor activities such as bushcraft, willow weaving and landscaping. Additionally, they will build
			natural shelters and welfare packages to ensure new additions such as sheep, chicken and donkeys are
			cared for.
